



His prayer for the Colossians is a wonderful example of how to pray for other Christians and how to pray for ourselves.




You will never know everything about God. However, our mistake is not desiring to know too much, but being satisfied with knowing too little.

False teaching usually falls into 2 categories:


1. Attacks on the work of Christ 2. Attacks on the Person of Christ




Doubling to aching distinction between






All three of these passages confirm that the Son is not Created, but is the Creator.

Series: Colossians

Sermon: Colossians 1:15-20

1. Most anyone you speak to these days is familiar with the name Jesus. However, the way they define Jesus may be in opposition to who He really is. Should we, as Christians, seek further information from those who profess to know Jesus to ensure that they know the right Jesus? Why, or why not?

- 2. Among Christians, the Son of God, is commonly acknowledged in the incarnation, crucifixion, resurrection, and ascension, however not as much for the creation of all things. Why do you suppose this is? (For scriptural support of this facts see John 1:1-3, Col.: 1:16-13, Heb. 1:1-2)
- 3. How does knowing that the Creator and Reconciler of all things, is also the one who has redeemed and forgiven you, serve to add security and comfort to your salvation?

4. Christology, the study of Christ, is often considered something only for theology students to be concerned with, however, Paul addresses all of the Colossians with these powerful statements about Jesus and expects them to grasp hold of them. Looking back at your Christian life, do you feel that Christianity was dumbed down in such a way that important truths were commonly skipped over? Explain why this might have happened, and how to remedy such a problem.

5. Read John 20:24-31. John says that we must believe that Jesus is the Son of God to be saved. Does he mean that we must believe that Jesus is the offspring of God, as in God the Father produced/created Him? Interpret this verse in light of John 1:1.
