# Did God Really Say? Created in God's Image: Ground Zero for Sexuality & Gender (Genesis 1-3)

### **INTRODUCTION**

For the next 6 Sundays, Lord willing, we are going to be working our way through a series **called "Did God Really Say?"** We are going to look at issues of marriage, parenting, and human sexuality.

What is a worldview? As the word itself suggests, a worldview is an overall view of the world. A worldview is the sum total of our beliefs about the world.

As followers of Christ, we must have a Christian worldview, especially when considering the sexual revolution around us. And this worldview must be rooted in God's word!

I. Genesis 1: \_\_\_\_\_

The emphasis in Genesis 1 is clearly on equality of value and equality of nature. The man and the woman are exalted in value and dignity because they are together the image bearers of Almighty God.

## II. Genesis 2: Equal but \_\_\_\_\_

In this part of the creation narrative, the emphasis is clearly now on differentiation. The critical issue for us to take from this text is first and foremost, that differentiation between the sexes was God's idea. God wanted humanity to be male and female. Differentiation is not the result of the fall. It precedes the fall. It is the essential design of God.

The emphasis in **Genesis 1** is on the equality and exalted dignity of the man and the woman. The emphasis in **Genesis 2** is on the difference between the sexes and their corresponding roles and responsibilities while at the same time, continuing to stress their essential equality. Equal but different.

Eve had seen that "the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise" (v 6). Her decision was a rational, reasonable calculation, supported by what her feelings were saying to her. How could it be wrong when it seemed good, looked delightful, and seemed wise? Especially when her husband agreed and shared the fruit with her. Isn't that our story, too? We do not cast our decisions to reject what God says as the actions of rebels. We really just see ourselves as owners and masters of ourselves. What could be so wrong? This is the drama of **Genesis 3**: the casting off of God's rule. They cast off the role of being God's royal ambassadors assigned to rule over creation in relationship with him, and instead struck out on their own. You can be like God in your own life, Satan told the first humans. You can have the authority. You know what's best. You can't trust God—but you can trust yourself. And the humans said, yes.

But the Bible's story isn't left in the past tense. It's in the present tense. What occurred in the garden has made its way down to you and me: "None is righteous, no, not one; no one understands; no one seeks for God ... no one does good ... there is no fear of God before their eyes." (Romans 3:10-11, 12, 18)

This is a beautiful world. But it is also a broken one. And it is filled with humans who are capable of great good and of great mistakes, who can reach great heights but who are fundamentally flawed. Our hearts, our minds, and our bodies are beautiful things, and they are broken things. They have been since Adam and Eve first decided they would be better rulers of this creation than its Creator. We are broken actors living on a broken stage, and we do not stand on the stage for very long.

Here's the good news: God does not leave us where we are. God promises to send someone into where we are to lead us out to a better future. Amen? God announces the promise of a serpent-slaying Savior. And what God announces...what God promises, He accomplishes. Jesus Christ is the serpent-slaying Savior of Genesis 3:15.
