Introduction: Calvinists believe in a limited atonementArminians object
1. How can the atonement be wonderful and glorious if it is limited to some?
Question: What is the real problem in understanding for the Arminian?
 You cannot preach the Gospel to all men—without distinction—as commanded by Jesus in Matthew 28:18-20, if Christ did not die to save everyone.
3. Limited atonement stifles if not kills evangelism.
