John 2:1-12

1 On the third day there was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. 2 Jesus also was invited to the wedding with his disciples. 3 When the wine ran out, the mother of Jesus said to him, “They have no wine.” 4 And Jesus said to her, “Woman, what does this have to do with me? My hour has not yet come.” 5 His mother said to the servants, “Do whatever he tells you.”

John 2:1-12

- *Woman, what does this have to do with me? John 19:26, 20:11-13, 15*
- *My hour has not yet come:*
 - **7:30** *So they were seeking to arrest him, but no one laid a hand on him, because **his hour had not yet come**.*
 - **8:20** *These words he spoke in the treasury, as he taught in the temple; but no one arrested him, because **his hour had not yet come**.*
 - **Matthew 26:45** *Then he came to the disciples and said to them, “Sleep and take your rest later on. See, **the hour is at hand**, and the Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners.*

- **Matthew 12:39** *But he answered them, “An evil and adulterous generation seeks for a sign, but no sign will be given to it except the sign of the prophet Jonah.*

Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested his glory. And his disciples believed in him.

- The sign manifested his glory-The veil of His deity and role as Messiah is beginning to lift (glory is revealed)
 - Don’t stop at the miracle, look to the source “***Jesus did***”
 - **Luke 5:8** *But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus’ knees, saying, “Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord.”*
- His disciples believed in him

9When the master of the feast tasted the water now become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the master of the feast called the bridegroom 10and said to him, “Everyone serves the good wine first, and when people have drunk freely, then the poor wine. But you have kept the good wine until now.”

- **2 Corinthians 4:16-18** *So we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. 17For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, 18as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal.*
- **Revelation 19:6-9** *Then I heard what seemed to be the voice of a great multitude, like the roar of many waters and like the sound of mighty peals of thunder, crying out, “Hallelujah! For the Lord our God the Almighty reigns. 7Let us rejoice and exult and give him the glory, for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and his Bride has made herself ready; 8it was granted her to clothe herself with fine linen, bright and pure”— for the fine linen is the righteous deeds of the saints. 9And the angel said to me, “Write this: Blessed are those who are invited to the marriage supper of the Lamb.” And he said to me, “These are the true words of God.”*
