II. If you rely upon law works to give you right standing with God, you are cursed. v. 10-12

- A. Because those who seek to be justified by the law can't keep it perfectly. v. 10 Dt. 27:26
 - 1. Of whom is Paul speaking? Rom. 10:3
 - 2. While it is true that someone who perfectly keeps God's law would be righteous, the problem is that no-one keeps it. 6:13 Ro. 2:13 3:10-18,23 Isa. 53:6 1 Ki. 8:46
 - 3. To break the law in any part puts one under the curse of condemnation. Dt. 27:26 Lev. 19:2 Js. 2:10 Pr. 20:9 Ecc. 7:20
 - 4. The law was never given as a means by which we could earn God's blessing, but rather, it was given to show us our need of grace. 3:24 2:16 Ro. 3:20,27-28 4:15
 - 5. Those who think that they can be saved by their efforts at religion and morality are under God's curse.
 - a. They are under a curse because their law-breaking demands a condemnation.
 - b. They are under a curse because they reject (curse) God's way of salvation. Gen. 12:3 Ps. 2:2-3,10-12 John 7:49 3:36
 - 6. The curse includes the just punishment of your sin which is more horrible than any of us can fully comprehend. 3:13 Ro. 5:18 Heb. 2:2 Rev. 20:8 2 Thess. 1:8
 - 7. This aspect of the gospel message is most offensive to human pride.
- B. Because justification is by faith, not the law. v. 11 Hab. 2:4
 - 1. God revealed to Habakkuk the principle that right status before God comes by faith. <u>Hab. 2:4-5 3:17-19</u> Heb. 10:38 Rom. 1:17
 - 2. In the same way we are justified unto life by faith (alone). Ro. 1:16-17 John 17:3
- C. Because the law and faith are totally incompatible. v. 12 Lev. 18:5
 - 1. The error of the Judaizers (that we must be saved by faith in Christ plus our works) continues to the present day.
 - 2. Scripture makes it plain that you must choose to rely either on the law or faith.
 - a. The one who relies upon the law expects to be saved by what he does. Ro. 10:3
 - b. Faith relies upon what God has done in Christ for salvation. Ro. 10:4,9
 - 3. Your works contribute nothing whatsoever to your justification. 2:16 Ps. 143:2
 - 4. Justification is by faith alone. 2:16 Rom. 10:9 5:1 Phil. 3:9 Titus 3:4-5
 - 5. But isn't it good for Christians to obey God's law? 5:13-15 6:2 Rom. 13:8-10
 - a. Law and faith are incompatible for justification. To rely upon your obedience in order to earn justification is a proud rejection of God's way of salvation.
 - b. Law and faith are compatible in other ways. It is good to obey God out of love and gratitude. John 14:15

III. If you rely solely upon Christ you are blessed. v. 13-14

- A. Christ redeemed believers from the law's curse. v. 13 Deut. 21:23
 - 1. How God can righteously save us by faith, given that we have broken His law and deserve to be punished? 3:10 Ro. 2:14-15 3:10-18,23 5:12-19 6:23 8:3 Gen. 3:17
 - 2. Substitution Christ willingly took the place of those of us who were accursed under the law. 1 Pet. 3:18 1 Co. 5:7 John 10:15 1:29
 - 3. Redemption Christ paid the full price to ransom/purchase us. 4:5 Rev. 5:9 1 Pet. 1:18-19 1 Co. 6:20 7:23 Acts 20:28 Mark 10:45
 - 4. Atonement Christ, who was sinless and innocent, was accursed of God for us on the cross. <u>Isa. 53:4-6,10</u> <u>2 Co. 5:21</u> 1 Pe. 2:24 Dt. 21:23 Acts 2:23 5:30 Mt. 27:46

- 5. For whom did Jesus die as a substitute, paying the price of redemption by His atoning blood? For those who believe! Eph. 5:25 John 10:11 Mark 10:45
- 6. His work is finished. John 19:30 1 Pet. 3:18 Heb. 7:27 9:28
- 7. The cross is a great offense to some. 5:11 1 Co. 1:18 Jer. 17:9
- 8. We ought to be grateful obedient people. Rom. 5:6-8 1 Co. 6:20 John 15:13
- B. Believers receive the blessing of Abraham. v. 14
 - 1. God's promises to Abraham are fulfilled in Christ for those who have faith, including the Gentiles. v. 6 John 1:16-17
 - 2. The reception of the Holy Spirit part of the Abrahamic blessing. v. 2,8-9 Acts 2:33 10:44-47 15:8-12 Joel. 2:28-29 Isa. 32:15 44:3 Ezek. 39:29 37:14
