## A Deep, Wise Gospel (1 Corinthians 2:6-13)

## I. **Introduction**

- A. The Bible's Greatest Secrets & Mysteries
- B. Review of the context (helps us understand the meaning of a text that is often misunderstood and misused)
- C. Read the passage and outline of the sermon
- II. **Wisdom 2:6-9** (Contrasting those who receive it and those who do not)
  - A. Is the message of the cross wisdom or foolishness?
    - 1. Hints that the message of the cross is indeed, **wisdom** (1 Cor 1:30)
    - 2. Re-defining **wisdom** from a philosophical worldly term to a soteriological biblical term (1 Cor 2:6)
      - a. The *message of the cross* is **wisdom**, but not the kind of wisdom (*sofia*) the Greeks sophists were used to
      - b. This is not an accommodation that Paul is making to Sophists
        - i. Contemporary examples of this kind of accommodation (Jesus will get you really high, and the Donut Man)
      - c. a strong contrast between them (1 Cor 2:7-8)
  - B. Those who *do* receive God's **wisdom** are called "*mature*" (1 Cor 2:6)
    - 1. tois teleois perfect, reaching the end
    - 2. *The mature* are not a higher class of Christian, but all Christians
      - a. Proven by the <u>contrast</u> those *who are doomed to pass away*
      - b. Why would the Holy Spirit use this word then?
        - i. The Corinthians thought themselves mature
        - ii. Paul is employing subtle irony in using this word
  - C. Are you mature?
    - 1. Do you believe the cross is the only solution to finally and fully deal with the consequences and guilt of your sin?
    - 2. Do you believe in Jesus, but think that you must add something of your own doing or self
      - a. If you are in this group, be admonished to rest 100% on *Christ crucified* as the only basis and hope for your salvation.
  - D. What **wisdom!** (1 Cor 2:8-9)
    - 1. The rulers of this age carried out God's purpose (Acts 4:27-28)
    - 2. A **wisdom** hidden from the perishing, revealed to the elect
      - a. Rejoice for this **wisdom** has been revealed to you!
- III. Spirit 2:10-13 (Contrasting the Holy Spirit and the spirit of the world)
  - A. The **wisdom** of God is revealed through the Spirit of God (2:10-11)
    - 1. Understanding this mystery requires a new birth (John 3:3-8)
  - B. God gave us His Spirit so that we might know His grace (2:12)
    - 1. Only a monergistic salvation is truly all of grace!
  - C. It comes to us by spiritual words (2:13)
    - 1. words taught to us by the Spirit
    - 2. a difficult verse to translate
      - a. interpreting, combining, or comparing?
      - b. spiritual things or spiritual men?
