## Introduction

- Home alone!
- Jesus Christ has given us work to do while He's gone. Matthew 28
- Jesus Christ is coming again, but we do not know when.
- Peter's teaching in light of Christ's soon return
  - Need to be "serious", of sound mind or right thinking—1 Peter 4:7
  - Mentally alert for effective prayer—1 Peter 4:7
  - Focused on fervently loving one another—1 Peter 4:8
  - Showing hospitality to others—1 Peter 4:9

## "Working Till He Comes"

- A. A "steward" is in charge of his master's household and business in the absence of the master.
- We are stewards of the "manifold grace of God"
  - We've been recipients of God's grace in salvation—Eph. 2
  - Each of us has been given a grace gift for ministry—1 Peter 4:10
- The word "gift" is lit. "gift of grace". Romans 12:6
  These gifts are "spiritual" in that...

  1) They are "manifestations of the Spirit"—1 Cor. 12:7

  - 2) They are distributed by the Spirit—1 Cor. 12:11 Definition of "spiritual gift"—"a God-given, special ability for service" c.
  - Spiritual gifts are for ministering to others, not for private use or hidden.
  - "Manifold" grace of God—many different kinds of spiritual gifts.—1 Corinthians 12; Romans 12; Ephesians 4; 1 Peter 4
  - Peter's Two Categories: Speaking Gifts and Serving Gifts
    - Reflect the division of ministry roles in Acts 6:2-4
    - Specific ways the gifts are to be administered
      - "If anyone speaks, as the oracles of God" -- 1 Peter 4:11a
        - Ministering God's Word to God's people
        - b) Very serious undertaking—2 Tim. 2:15; 4:1-2
      - "If anyone ministers, as with the ability that God supplies"
        - a) Every gift is a "serving" gift
        - Need to rely on God's strength and ability
- C. Since as "stewards of God's grace" we owe everything to God, He therefore receives ALL the glory—1 Peter 4:11
- D. What does Jesus hope to find when He returns?
  - Faithful, wise stewards—Luke 12:42-44; 1 Corinthians 4:1-2
  - The temptation to quit early—1 Thess. 3
