Sermon Series: Romans

Sermon Text: Romans 8:31-39 Assurance of Universal Dominion

In our great conflict with evil, we have assurance of our conquest and universal dominion because of God's sovereign grace and Christ's perfect and perpetual work.

- 1) In Christ we have great conflict with evil (8:35-36).
 - a) There are enemies who would separate us from the love of Christ (v. 35a).
 - b) There are many evils in this world (v. 35b).
 - c) Christian's suffer evil for the sake of Christ (v. 36).
- 2) In Christ we have assurance of our conquest and universal dominion.
 - a) God graciously gives us all things with Christ (8:32).
 - b) We are more than conquerors through Christ (8:37).
 - c) Because of God's sovereign grace (8:31-33):
 - i) Assurance from Sovereign Grace: What shall we say to these things, namely, God's sovereign grace extolled in verses 28-30? If God is for us, who can be against us?
 - ii) Assurance from Argument from Greater to Lesser (v. 32):
 - (1) Greater: God already gave us the greatest gift in the death of His own Son.
 - (2) Lesser: So, He will give us every lesser gift promised to us, namely, "all things."
 - iii) Assurance from God's sovereign grace in justification (v. 33).
 - d) Because of Christ's perfect and perpetual work (8:34):
 - i) Assurance from Christ's death (v. 34a)
 - ii) Assurance from Christ's resurrection (v. 34b)
 - iii) Assurance from Christ's ascension/intercession (v. 34c)
 - e) **Application**: Inseparable from God's love in Christ you can (8:38-39):
 - i) Conquer death and life
 - ii) Conquer demon empowered rulers ("angels . . . rulers, . . . powers")
 - iii) Conquer anticipated and unanticipated opposition ("things present nor things to come")
 - iv) Conquer transcendent powers of evil ("height . . . depth")
 - v) Conquer all creation ("anything else in all creation")
