#### Introduction

Jesus always heals entirely, completely.

"they turned to the Lord." v35

More than just believing, the people repent and turn to the Lord when they witness His power on display.

"She was full of good works and acts of charity." v36

Peter and Jonah – a comparison in contrast

"they had washed her" v37

God gives more work to working saints.

(v39) God fills the hearts of those served with great affection and deep appreciation for the selfless servant.

"put them all outside"

"knelt down and prayed"

Peter demonstrates tremendous power in prayer.

"Tabitha arise"

"Talitha cumi" (Mark 5:49).

"many believed in the Lord." v42

"many people believed in the Lord"

Peter no longer had any prejudice against Gentiles.

The apostle Paul ascribes the power he needed to endure a hard life and ministry to divine power.

- 3. Worship individual and corporate
- 4. Faith/Unwavering belief in God (Acts 16:5; 1 Cor. 2:4-5)
- 5. Humility (2 Cor. 12:9; 2 Cor. 13:4)
- 6. Fellowship/Encouragement (Acts 15:30-32)
- 7. Selfless acts of Service (1 Pet. 4:10-11 above)
