- B. Jesus gives examples of supernatural love. v. 29-30

- D. How literally are we to take these commands?
 - 1. Jesus is not abrogating all rights to self-defense and private property.
 - 2. Jesus' call to love has to do with our personal responses and does not mean civil authorities shouldn't resist evil (pacifism). 3:14 Ro. 13:4 1 Pe. 2:13f Acts 16:37ff
 - 3. We are not precluded from confronting and warning those who do wrong. 6:24-26 Mt. 18:15ff 23:13ff 1 Co. 16:22 John 18:22-23 Gal. 2:11ff 6:1
 - 4. Nor are we expected to enable sluggards and criminals while forsaking our responsibilities to our own families. 2 Thess. 3:10 1 Tim. 5:8

III. Only God's children are able to imitate His supernatural love. v. 32-36

- A. True children of God surpass the natural love of the world. v. 32-34 Mt. 5:46-47
 - 1. Sinners typically love those who love them reciprocal (mercenary) love.
 - 2. Has the gospel transformed you to be able to love beyond reciprocity?
- B. As God's son (child), you are called to love in the way that God loves. v. 35b-36 Mt. 5:45,48 1 Jo. 4:19 Ex. 34:6 Js. 5:11
 - 1. He shows kindness to all of His (ungrateful) enemies in common grace. v. 35b Mt. 5:45 Ro. 1:21,28-32 2 Tim. 3:2 Acts 17:24ff Ps. 145:8-9,15-17

- 2. God has shown great mercy to you, His former enemy, in saving grace. v. 36 Ro. 5:6-10 2:4 Col. 1:21 Eph. 2:1ff 1 Pe. 2:3 Neh. 9:19 Ps. 25:6
- 3. Jesus perfectly lives out what He commands. 22:39ff Phil. 2:5ff John 15:13 Acts 10:38 1 Pe. 2:20-23 Mt. 12:19f 26:53,67 Mark 14:65 15:16-20 Isa. 53:10-12 Mt. 12:19-20 26:53
- 4. He calls you to imitate His love. v. 35a Eph. 4:31-5:2
- C. As God's children you are able to love supernaturally. v. 35-36 1 Jo. 3:1-2
 - 1. You share His divine nature. 2 Pet. 1:4 2 Co. 5:17
 - 2. He empowers us to love and to show mercy. Ro. 5:5
 - 3. Supernatural love proves that you are truly His child. John 13:35 1 Jo. 4:7-8
- D. What reward should we expect for loving in this godlike way? v. 35b 6:23 Rev. 21:7

IV. Application: How can we put these hard things into practice?

- A. First be sure that you are able to do supernatural things.
 - 1. Are you a child of God? 1 Jo. 5:1
 - 2. Are you are abiding in Christ and walking in the Spirit? John 15:5 Gal. 5:16ff Eph. 3:14-21 4:31-5:2
- B. Then step forth in faith and attempt supernatural things. Rom. 12:14-21
 - 1. Cultivate an attitude of love towards your enemies. 1 Co. 4:7
 - 2. Deliberately, actively and generously do good to those who hate you. Ro. 12:20f
 - 3. Bless those who curse or insult you. Prov. 15:1 Luke 12:51-53
 - 4. Pray for those who mistreat you.
 - 5. Don't fight for your rights or seek revenge when wronged, but entrust judgment to God. Ps. 3:7 Rom. 12:19 1 Co. 6:1ff Pr. 17:14 Mt. 5:38 Ex. 21:23-25
 - 6. Lend (or give) to those who may never be able to pay you back. 14:13-14
 - 7. Positively treat others as you wish you were being treated.
- C. It is only through the cross that such radical supernatural love is possible.
 - 1. Jesus died both to remove the penalty you deserve for your failure to love...
 - 2. And to give you the power to love as He loves. 24:49

 - b. What action can you take to show love to each of these people?
 - c. Will you commit to praying for each of them at least once a week?
