### **Introduction to John 17**

- A. Final Instructions to Anxious Disciples -- John 13:31-35
  - 1. Now is the Son of Man is Glorified v. 31-32

#### Isaiah 49:3-6

"And He said to me, you are My servant, O Israel, In whom I will be glorified."

<sup>4</sup> Then I said, 'I have labored in vain, I have spent my strength for nothing and in vain; Yet surely my just reward *is* with the LORD, And my work with my God.' "

<sup>5</sup> "And now the LORD says, Who formed Me from the womb *to be* His Servant, To bring Jacob back to Him, So that Israel is agathered to Him (For I shall be glorious in the eyes of the LORD, And My God shall be My strength),

<sup>6</sup> Indeed He says, 'It is too small a thing that You should be My Servant To raise up the tribes of Jacob, And to restore the preserved ones of Israel; I will also give You as a light to the Gentiles, That You should be My salvation to the ends of the earth.' "

- B. Let not your Heart be Troubled -- John 14:1-6
  - 1. Heart v. 1

**John 12:27** – Jesus as a man was not an unfeeling stoic – but the remedy was not to give into the "unsettled or stirred up feeling".

**John 13:21** – Here he is described as "troubled in His spirit".

- 3. Jesus Prays for Us 20-26
- A. The first thing to ask Is this prayer a model prayer for us?
- B. He lifted up His eyes to Heaven. v. 1
- C. Limited Atonement v. 2
- D. How does anyone come to know God? v. 3
- E. Finished the Work v. 4

#### F. His Reward v. 5
