Praxis

- 1) Isa 28:12, 30:15 – what was the physical “rest, relief, repose” that was previously promised to the Jewish people (see Deut 28:1-14)? What would make a people want to “not hear” such gracious promises?
- 2) Isa 28:16 – consider the 6 NT usages of this statement to refer to Jesus (Mt 21:42 / Lk 20:17, Rom 9:33, 10:11, Eph 2:20, 1 Pt 2:6). What does collective picture of Jesus by these NT references teach us about how you should respond to Him?
- 3) Isa 29:22-24 – what do these verses teach us about the ways we should be before the Lord?
- 4) Isa 30:18 – what opportunities do you have with a wayward individual to wade into with God’s character of loyal love and mercy – with both humble woes and patient wooing? What exactly would that look like for you? What exactly are your hesitations?
