## II. Exposition of the text

- A. The wisdom of God in the foolish message of the cross (2:12)
  - 1. A subtle rebuke that comes to full force in 1 Cor 3:1-4
  - 2. This understanding is a gift not attained by their own wisdom
- B. 1 Corinthians 2:13
  - 1. The Gospel comes in words understood only by spiritual men
  - 2. A verse that is difficult to translate (comp ESV, NASB, KJV)
    - a. sugkrino = compare, combine, or interpret
    - b. pneumatikos = spiritual things, spiritual words, spiritual men
      - i. KJV comparing what? (Scripture with Scripture)
      - ii. Matching spiritual thoughts to spiritual people
- C. The natural man cannot understand the Gospel (2:14)
  - 1. Man's complete inability
    - a. failure of the church to understand this doctrine
      - i. Pelagius (4<sup>th</sup> Century)
      - ii. Arminius, Wesley (Reformation era)
      - iii. Charles Finney
      - iv. Baptist, Pentecostal and Emergent practices today
      - v. But Reformed churches???
- D. He who is spiritual judges all things ... (2:15)
  - 1. The spiritual man has lived in both realms so he can discern both
- E. 1 Corinthians 2:16 (support from Isaiah 40:13)
  - 1. Isaiah 40 is about God's intention to save His people
  - 2. Isaiah's Yahweh is applied by Paul, to Christ
  - 3. Spirit (Hebrew, ruach) is translated mind (nous) in the Septuagint
  - 4. Paul's exultation in sovereign grace (Rom 11:33-34)
- F. Do you know the mind of the Lord? Are you a Christian?

- B. What does it mean to have the mind of Christ?
  - 1. We understand God's intent in the Gospel and cross
  - 2. We understand how to apply the Scripture to our lives (Ro 12:2)
- C. The unfortunate history of application of this text
  - 1. spiritual elitism and Christian "classes"
- D. The mind of Christ is the key to unity in the church
  - 1. Rom 15:5,6, 2 Cor 13:11-14, Phil 1:27-28, 2:2, 1 Pet 3:8
- E. The mind of Christ embodies humility and service (Phil 2:2-8)
