## Loving Instead of Retaliating Matthew 5:38-48

## Main Point:

When you were His enemy, Jesus loved you; therefore, instead of retaliating, love your enemies.

1. Though you are prone to retaliate, Jesus says you must not.

2. Instead, you must love even your enemies.

3. Loving your enemies is a defining characteristic of a child of God.

4. You can love your enemies because, when you were His enemy, Jesus loved you.
