I. Jesus, Walking on the Water -- Matthew 14:22-33

A. William Hendricksen's Outline

B. The Miracle is Recorded here and in Mark and John.

- 1. Mark does not mention of Peter coming out to walk on the sea.
- 2. Mark tells us Jesus looked as though he would have "passed them by".
- 3. All 3 accounts note Jesus said, "Be of good cheer. It is I. Be not afraid."
- 4. John adds some important detail -- John 6:15-21
 - 1) Jesus withdrew because the crowd was so enamored by the miracle of the feeding of the 5,000, they were ready to make him king.
 - 2) John adds another miracle found in v. 21
 - 3) The rest of John 6 highlights Jesus as the bread of life and the true bread which came down from heaven.

5. An Old Testament Connection

Psalm 107:23-32 Psalm 89:8-9

C. Observations from Matthew's Account

- 1. While the disciples battled the storm Jesus was praying for them. 22-23
- 2. The wind was "contrary" to them v. 23b-24
- 3. He not only prayed for them He rescued them! V. 25-27
- 4. Turn your eyes upon Jesus v. 28-32
- 5. The disciples worshipped him v. 33

II. Healing our Diseases -- Matthew 14:34-36

III. The Healing of the Gentile Woman's Daughter Matt. 15:21-28

We will deal with this by way of observation.

v. 21 – This was Gentile territory ruled by Phillip – the ex-husband of Herodias.

Mark 7:24 -- From there He arose and went to the region of Tyre and Sidon. And He entered a house and wanted no one to know *it*, but He could not be hidden.

The language of "dogs" (v. 26 & 27).

Phil 3:23 – metaphorically – one who corrupts the truth of God.

Rev. 22:14-15 – metaphorically those shut out of the kingdom.

O.T. – metaphorically, the Gentiles

Christ uses a diminutive form of the word "dog". "little dogs" or "house dogs". v.27 -- The woman seems to grasp it as a ray of hope.

v. 28 -- Only two people are praised in the book of Matthew for "their faith". This Gentile woman and the Gentile Centurion in Matthew 8.

IV. Ministering in a Gentile Land 15:29-31

Foreshadowing the gospel going into all nations.

V. Feeding the 4,000 15:32-39

Final Observations and Applications

- 1. Notice the compassion of the Lord Jesus Christ.
- 2. People often care much more for their physical needs than the spiritual.
- 3. The importance of being persevering in prayer.
- 4. She worshipped him before her daughter was healed, even after she was basically told "no".
