1 Peter 2:21-25

What does Peter mean when he writes "to this you were called?" Read John 16:1-4; Romans 8:16-17; Matthew 10:16-25.

- 1. Was it, in context, to the slaves who might have crooked masters and be forced to suffer unjustly?
- 2. Was it for believers to seek suffering to prove their faith?
- 3. Was it simply an acknowledgment that all believers either will or may suffer for the sake of Christ?

What is the first comfort for the suffering believer? Read 2 Corinthians 5:17-19; John 10:14-16.

- 1. 1 Peter 2:25 claims what turn of events in the life of a believer?
