## I. The Idea

# The Keeper of the Vineyard

- A. The vineyard symbolizes their relationship and Solomon is the keeper of the vineyard.
  - 1. He comes to her and speaks to her in love
  - 2. Solomon is pursuing the Shulamite declaring his love and showing her the time is right for them to be married and to be together intimately.
- B. The Shulamite brings up struggles for them using the figure of a vineyard (vs. 15).
  1. She speaks of the little foxes these are nuisance pests in a garden.
  - 2. Seeing the reality of these nuisances, she requests that he tend to the vineyard.

### II. The Significance

A. Christ's love for the church. Christ is the keeper of His vineyard, the church.

- 1. He does everything to establish with us a bond of love and friendship.
- 2. The prophet Isaiah speaks of this in Isaiah 5:1-7
- B. In the words of the Shulamite, we have expressed the desire of the church.1. The church is watching and waiting for Christ's return.
