APPLICATION QUESTIONS

FOR WEDNESDAY NIGHT

- 1. How did Jesus show his love to his closest friends?
- 2. Discuss the exchange between Jesus and Peter. What does Jesus mean when he says a man who has bathed needs no further washing?
- 3. Do you understand Jesus when he starts discussing, "A servant is not greater than his master..."?

- 4. Peter stands out in this chapter; he seems to be outspoken and to wear his emotions on his sleeve. How do you think Peter felt when Jesus predicted his denial? (Vs. 38) Have there been any times in your life when you've unintentionally denied Jesus, even if it was by keeping your mouth shut? How can you prepare your heart and mind for future situations?
- 5. Jesus gives us an example of how to show our love to others. He then finishes the chapter with a new commandment to love one another. (Vs. 35) Do people really know we are Christians by our love? Consider how implementing these things into your life would impact the people/ community around you. Can it be done? Is it practical to love those who seem impossible to love?
