## Reconciliation: The Revelation of One Mediator

Jesus: Very God, Very Man, Very God-Man

This is the fourth message, in the series on Reconciliation:

## TEXT:

'For there is one God; there is also one mediator between God and Man, Christ Jesus, himself human, who gave himself a ransom for all...' (1Timothy 2:5-6a).

## THE TWO-WAY MOVEMENT:

In Philippians 2:1-4 we learn that the **Lord** became **Servant**. God the humble servant. In Mark 4:35-41 we glimpse that this **Servant** in the boat is **Lord** of 'the wind and the sea'.

As we *glimpse* by faith, that in Jesus, God has humbly come to us in our dysfunctional earthly home, and that in Jesus, we have been crucified – and taken home to God into his peaceful heavenly home, we are *glimpsing* the Living God in action. This is gospel **revelation**: Wow!

As the centurion *glimpsed* it, he said: 'Truly this man was God's Son!' (Mark 15:39). All that Jesus accomplished, in his earthly life, he did so as a true man. Unlike Superman, he didn't occasionally rush into a nearby phone box, and put on his 'God' suit. He didn't just press a 'power-button'. Or as Geoff Bingham would say: 'he never called upon his deity, in order to effect his humanity'. This must mean, that when Jesus rebuked the wind and calmed the sea, he did so as a man. What might this mean for our redeemed bodies? This must also mean that in that 'hour' when Jesus is totally forsaken, and dies, he does so as a man, for us. When Charles Wesley unexpectedly *glimpsed* this man was actually God suffering for us, he wrote:

Never love nor sorrow was, like that my Saviour showed: See Him stretched on yonder Cross, And crushed beneath our load! Now discern the Deity, Now His heavenly birth declare! Faith cries out, 'Tis He, 'Tis He, My God who suffers there!

As we proclaim God's **finished work** of reconciliation—and live in it, daily, by faith—it helps to consider what Jesus accomplished as true God (from the *Godward* side), and what Jesus accomplished as true Man (from the *human* side, as our Champion). He is the Mediator.

Today, the thing that is taking place by the Holy Spirit's power is a mighty *revelation* of the Living Man Jesus, who is also the Living Lord-God. It is the Holy Spirit's task to convict of sin, righteousness and judgment (John 16:8), on the basis of Jesus entire *both-ways* ministry.

<u>Prayer</u>: Thank you Lord God, that you came, 'born of Mary' to serve your world. Thank you Lord Jesus, that as the One Mediator for our human race, you *vicariously* took us up, into the cross, as you were crucified. Thank you Lord Jesus, that as you ascended and went *home* to the Father, you also went *home* to *Our Father*, reconciling the world to God. We praise You! **Trevor** 

## CHILDREN'S TALK:

The Holy Spirit brings the *Revelation* of the *Reconciliation* in Jesus Christ, of God and Man.
