- 3. Sola Deo Gloria is not a new concept, but has been demonstrated throughout history
  - A. Christ, the Son of God, is the only Rock upon which the church is built
    - 1. Augustine (d. 430)
  - B. All believers are priests
    - 1. Irenaeus (c. 180)
    - 2. Celement of Alexandria (c. 195)
    - 3. Tertullian (d. 225)
  - C. Worshiping God alone through a sincere heart
    - 1. Lactantius (c. 304)
- 4. Christological focus: Jesus' life and ministry points to the glory of God alone
  - A. His birth (Luke 2:13-20)
  - B. His miracles (Luke 5:17-26)
  - C. His nature as God (John 8:48-59)
  - D. His humiliation as a man (Philippians 2:5-11)
- 5. We still have a tendency to undermine Soli Deo Gloria today
  - A. The glory of the human mind (worldly wisdom)
  - B. The glory of the institutional church or denomination
  - C. The glory of man through the cult of celebrity
  - D. Everything you do is an opportunity to glorify God! (1 Corinthians 10:31)
  - E. Do not rob God of the glory due his name (Isaiah 42:8, Revelation 21)
