#### Mark 16:9-20 — "Understanding Mark's Ending & the Great Commission"

It is reassuring at the end to find that the general result of all these discoveries and all this study is to strengthen the proof of the authenticity of the Scriptures, and our conviction that we have in our hands, in substantial integrity, the veritable Word of God (Sir Frederick Kenyon).

We have a wealth of manuscripts to draw from, and we stand on the shoulders of those who spent their lives studying manuscripts and refining the methods of textual criticism. Our extremely accurate, modern editions of the New Testament are possible because of the labors of many people whom you may never know about. Whether or not you realize it, you're probably using the fruits of textual criticism every day.

### The main argument:

## ★Mark's gospel ends at Mark 16:8 — "for they were afraid."

- The earliest and most reliable Greek mss extant (we have) clearly show Mark's text ends here.
- And early Christian writers also affirm it ends here: Clement of Alexandria 215AD; Origen 250AD; Eusebius 330AD; Jerome 420AD).
- But various manuscripts have different "endings to mark" (often called the Shorter & Longer endings: vv.9-20) & variations therein

We need to examine these endings in two general categories (the science of "textual criticism"):

### 1. EXTERNAL evidence (outside the text)

- how many? the quantity of manuscripts [how many manuscripts support a certain "reading"]
- where are the manuscripts from? (Israel, Egypt, Asia Minor, Syria)
- what language?

### **2. INTERNAL evidence** (inside the text)

- The grammar
- The vocabulary
- The style
- The theology

Conclusion by Bruce Metzger (New Testament Scholar of the Biblical Texts/Manuscripts):

 On the basis of good external evidence and strong internal considerations it appears that the earliest ascertainable form of the Gospel of Mark ended with 16:8.

• In Greek alone, there are more than 5,800 manuscripts today. Many of these are fragmentary, especially the older ones, but the average Greek NT [New Testament] MS [manuscript] is over 450 pages long. Altogether, there are more than 2.6 million pages of text, leaving hundreds of witnesses for every book of the NT. (Dan Wallace).

#### So then:

- ★ The Bible is <u>accurate</u> archeologically, geographically, historically, systematically, scientifically, prophetically, and it is <u>miraculous</u> in that it is life changing. It was <u>written</u> over a span of 1,500 years, by more than 40 authors, spanning 3 continents, and yet is perfect in <u>accuracy</u> & perfectly <u>unified</u> in theology.

### So what part can YOU play in the Great Commission?

- Prayer. For the missionaries Dorothy Callier, Sean Ransom, Liam Kim, Ratan Konala.
- Giving. Generous, sacrificial giving. Give to the support. Hold the rope while others go down deep into the well itself. So you support those who go down to the mission field.
- Contact. Encourage the missionaries regularly via communication.
- Going. To the lost; opening the mouth; speaking of Christ; communicating Truth.
- Disciple-making. Your obligation is to "teach" others to "obey all Christ commanded"
- Outward-oriented. We are upward (glorify God), inward (love the saints), forward (toward heaven),
   \*and\* we must remember to be outward (toward the lost!)
- Consider. Is God calling you to missionary work? to labor? to serve? to go? Have you prayed about where God may have you to serve (young, old, single, married, retired)?

The preaching of the Word of God must be the central element of the witness of any local church, because our Bibles say that it is through preaching that men and women are saved. We must seek to engage with others person to person.

This seems to be where so many of us are falling short as Christians.

Too often either we cannot or will not engage with transgressors so as to teach them God's ways. No one becomes a Christian by osmosis, by silent and unwitting absorption of the truth. No one sucks up Christianity just from being around us and suddenly becomes a Christian without being informed of the truth as it is in Jesus. Carrying around a Bible to show yourself a Christian might eventually spark an interest in someone. However, opening it, speaking it, and living it is evangelism, whereas simply having a Bible, however profoundly displayed, cannot be more than a preliminary maneuver intended to open the door to closer dealings with a needy sinner.
