"Party Pooper"

Introduction

- "Every party has a pooper! That's why we invited you!"
- "Party Pooper"—a "drag, killjoy, spoilsport, wet blanket"
- The prodigal son and the extravagant grace of his father
- Pharisees and scribes looking for someone to set the story straight!

"Party Pooper"

A. The Return of the Party Pooper—Luke 15:25-27

- 1. Not a symbol of a true believer, but the "Pharisee" figure in the story
- 2. Returning from the field, unaware that his brother had come home.
 - a. Why wasn't he told? Father knew he was a "party pooper"
 - b. Earlier signs of a strained relationship between the father and elder son.
- 3. The "smells" and "sounds" of celebration—v. 26
- 4. The interrogation of the servant boy—v. 26
 - a. Why ask a servant boy? Why not ask the father?
 - b. Servant boy's reply: "Your brother is safe and sound at home, and your father has killed the fatted calf to celebrate"

B. The Response of the Party Pooper—Luke 15:28

- 1. "He became angry"—Blew his top!
 - a. Pharisees' Response: "Yes! Finally!"
 - b. His anger reveals his hidden resentment toward his father
 - c. The "passive-aggressive" behavior of the elder son
- 2. "He refused to go in"—Boycotted the party!

C. The "Reversal" of the Party Pooper and Prodigal

- 1. Party pooper on the "outside"; Prodigal on the "inside"
- 2. Why? The Parable of the Two Sons—Matthew 21:24-32
 - a. The question concerning Jesus' authority—vv. 24-27
 - b. The parable of "reversal"—why some who think they should be on the inside are on the outside of God's kingdom!—vv. 28-32
 - 1) Pharisees were all talk, no action—thus excluded
 - Tax Collectors and sinners refused at first, then repented and thus included. They accepted God's grace.
 - 3) Pharisees on outside for rejecting God's grace
- 3. Parable applied: Prodigal inside for he experienced the grace of his father; whereas the party pooper is on the outside, knowing nothing of the extravagant grace of his father—but in need of forgiveness and grace!

D. The "Reaching Out" to the Party Pooper—Luke 15:28
