God's Call For His People To Be A Treasured Possession Requires Testing To Prove Genuineness, (vs. 1 - 20)

- God's Testing Brings Seasons Of Want Though God Has Promised Abundance, (vs. 1 4)
 - 4. God has promised to be our daily protection in times of exposure, (vs. 4)
 - 4a) Remember, God Has Provided All That You Need

"Clothing Did Not Wear (Perf) Out"

"And others are the ones sown among thorns. They are those who hear the word, but the cares of the world and the deceitfulness of riches and the desires for other things enter in and choke the word, and it proves unfruitful. But those that were sown on the good soil are the ones who hear the word and accept it and bear fruit, thirtyfold and sixtyfold and a hundredfold."" (Mark 4:18–20, ESV)

4b) Remember, God Has Preserved You During Difficulty

"Foot Did Not Swell (Perf)"

"I tell you, my friends, do not fear those who kill the body, and after that have nothing more that they can do. But I will warn you whom to fear: fear him who, after he has killed, has authority to cast into hell. Yes, I tell you, fear him! Are not five sparrows sold for two pennies? And not one of them is forgotten before God. Why, even the hairs of your head are all numbered. Fear not; you are of more value than many sparrows." (Luke 12:4–7, ESV)

- 1) "And he said to his disciples, "Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat, nor about your body, what you will put on. 2) For life is more than food, and the body more than clothing. 3) Consider the ravens: they neither sow nor reap, they have neither storehouse nor barn, and yet God feeds them. Of how much more value are you than the birds! 4) And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life? If then you are not able to do as small a thing as that, why are you anxious about the rest?" (Luke 12:22–26, ESV)
- 1) As God's children, we need not worry about temporal things.

- 4) Why would we choose to disobey when our actions will not change anything?
