7. What will happen when God shows His grace to His people (vv. 19-22)?
8. What will be the effects on society when God is gracious to His people and they repent (vv. 23-26)?
9. What does it mean to repent?
10. Does repentance need to be proclaimed and taught today?
11. How necessary is repentance for salvation?
12. How often does a Christian need to repent?
13. Does repentance merit (earn) forgiveness of your sins?
