THE LIFE OF JOSEPH – SERMON 13

FORGETTING AND FRUITFULNESS

Genesis 41:50-52

INTRODUCTION

- Previously we have seen how Joseph is a type of Christ as the Son and the Servant
- Here he pictures Christ the Sovereign:
 - ✓ The Spirit was upon him (41:38; Acts 10:38)
 - ✓ Possessed God's wisdom (41:39; John 5:20; Matthew 13:54)
 - ✓ All were commanded to bow the knee to him (41:43; Philippians 2:9-11)
 - ✓ His name means "revealer of secrets" and "saviour" (41:45;
 Matthew 13:35; 1:21; John 4:42)
 - ✓ He took a Gentile bride (41:45; Ephesians 2:6;3:6;5:23-32)
 - ✓ He was thirty years old when his ministry began (41:46; Luke 3:23)
 - ✓ He was highly exalted after his sufferings (41:49; Philippians 2:9-11)
 - ✓ He provided bread to multitudes (41:56; Matthew 14:13-21; John 6:35)
 - ✓ He was visited and honoured by all nations (41:57; Psalm 72:17; Isaiah 2:2-3;49:6; Zechariah 14:16-17)
- In blessing Joseph, God gave him a family of his own.
- Children are a gift from God (Psalm 127:3)
- In Bible times, names had great significance.
- In these names we are given an insight into Joseph's own state of mind at this time.

- ✓ Manasseh forgetting
- ✓ Ephraim doubly fruitful

I. GOD MAKES US FORGET THE FORMER SORROWS

- A. There is a wrong type of forgetfulness cf. 41:1
 - We are not to forget God, His benefits to us, and our duty to Him (Psalm 103:2)
 - 2. We are not to forget our duty to our neighbour (Genesis 41:1)
- B. There is a right type of forgetfulness
 - 1. This is a work that God performs in us
 - 2. Not effected by will-power
 - 3. Not simply a matter of "Time healing all wounds"
- C. We must forget those sins which God has forgiven and cleansed us of
 - 1. The need for the *unsaved* is to remember and grieve over their sins, seeking forgiveness through Christ
 - 2. Believers can have confidence that God has forgiven them all their sins, past, present and future
 - 3. This forgiveness is based upon God's faithfulness and justice (1 John 1:9)
 - 4. The promise of the New Covenant is that God "will remember their sin no more" (Jeremiah 31:34; Hebrews 10:16-17)
 - 5. It means He will not hold those sins against us; He lays them aside and does not regard them

- 6. As far as the east is from the west, so far hath he removed our transgressions from us. (Psalm 103:12)
- 7. The devil is the accuser of the brethren (Revelation 12:10)
- D. We must forget the sorrow of the past
 - God healed the pain, anguish, grief, bitterness of Joseph's trials
 - 2. Christ came to "heal the brokenhearted" (Luke 4:18-19)
 - 3. Many people are weighed down with the past, refusing to let it go
 - 4. This is a hindrance to fruitfulness
 - 5. We must lay aside every weight in order to run the race (Hebrews 12:1)
 - 6. We must forget those things which are behind (Philippians 3:13-14)

II. GOD MAKES FORGETTERS INTO FRUITFUL SERVANTS

- A. Joseph glorified God for all the blessings he received
 - 1. All we are and have is a gift of God's free grace (2 Corinthians 9:8)
- B. Because he had laid aside the sorrows of the past, he was able to bear fruit
 - 1. There is no sign of malice towards those who hurt him
- C. God blessed "in the land of my affliction"
 - The solution to our problems is not a removal of them or from them

- 2. Affliction produces fruit (John 12:23-26)
- 3. Realising that God uses these afflictions to make us fruitful, we ought to look at them as being for our good, not evil (Psalms 119:75)
- 4. God is able to make our branches "run over the wall" of our circumstances (Genesis 49:22)

CONCLUSION

- 1. Memory is the faculty of the mind
- 2. This shows us that a fruitful, prosperous Christian life requires a disciplined heart and mind (2 Corinthians 10:5)
- 3. Through prayer, distressful thoughts are replaced by God's peace (Philippians 4:6-7)
- 4. When we fill our minds and lives with right thoughts, there is no room for wrong thoughts (Philippians 4:8; Psalm 1:1-3; 2 Peter 1:5-8)
- 5. In the eternal state, "the former shall not be remembered" by the redeemed (Isaiah 65:16-17; Revelation 21:4)
- 6. What past griefs and hurts are you holding onto, hindering your fruitfulness in God's service?
- 7. Will you yield these unto God?
