1 Peter 3:1-7

Peter is addressing in context a group of people who may have trouble submitting to authority due to unfair treatment.

Read 1 Corinthians 7:12-16.

- 1. Why might society during the New Testament time period have neglected to address the duties of wives in this way?
- 2. How do Paul and Peter complement each other in these two passages?
- 3. Peter says women with unbelieving husbands act in submission and righteousness for what purpose?
- 4. At the same time, Paul reminds both husbands and wives that they cannot assume that God will do what (v. 16)?

What does proper conduct of wives look like? Read 1 Timothy 2:9-10.

- 1. What is a woman who focuses on her appearance trying to do? Who is she drawing attention to?
