PSALM 115 | A SONG OF TRUST

Background: It's never fun to be bullied, is it? Psalm 115 seems to be a response to heathen nations who taunted God's people in the Old Testament. In it, the psalmist makes it clear where the right—and wrong—places are to put our trust.
