The pursuit of holiness is sometimes viewed in a haughty, unattractive light, but our confession in this hymn is of the essence of true holiness: an acknowledgement of or sinful pride and a reliance upon God to make us different.

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Assurance of Pardoning Grace

What God envisioned in Exodus 19 for His covenant people He has accomplished in Christ for the Church, a covenant people (who have been given citizenship in Israel, Ephesians 2:12, 19!).

But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. ¹⁰ Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

¹¹ Beloved, I urge you as sojourners and exiles to abstain from the passions of the flesh, which wage war against your soul. ¹² Keep your conduct among the Gentiles honorable, so that when they speak against you as evildoers, they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day of visitation.

Distribution of Elements

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer and encourage wine for those who take part in Communion. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles.
