# A. General Factors that contributed to His popularity

- Not Jesus' good looks—Isaiah 53:2
- Jesus' personality and the manner in which He interacted with others.
- Jesus' display of power and success.
- Great attraction: Jesus' teaching Matt. 7:28-29; John 7:46
  - Bold assertions Jesus made at Capernaum—John 6
  - Peoples' Response: Hardened Unbelief—John 6:41-42
    - Stumbled over Jesus' claim to be from heaven.
    - Those who continually reject the truth, God hardens. John 12:37-40 and Matthew 13:11-15
    - Final Response: Deserted Jesus —John 6:66

## B. Ultimate Factor: Drawn by the Father John 6:43-51

- Man, of his own free will, is unable to come to Christ.
- We are drawn to Christ by being "taught by the Father" -v. 45-46
  - Since the day of Pentecost, the "teaching" ministry of God has been delegated to the Holy
    - 1) The Spirit brings us under conviction of sin—John 16:8
    - The Spirit opens our eyes and enables us to understand the truth of the gospel
    - Through the truth of God's Word, God draws people to embrace His Son.
    - Everyone who hears and learns from the Father comes to Christ.
  - Before Pentecost, Jesus' Christ was God's representative—v. 46
- We are drawn to Christ by believing Christ's message—vv. 47-51
  - "I am the Bread of Life"—the source of eternal life!
  - - "Anyone who eats of this bread will live forever" Meaning of "eating": to "believe"—v. 47
    - The parallels between "eating" and "spiritual truth"
      - Food is useless unless eaten.
      - b) Eating is prompted by hunger
      - c) Food becomes part of us through digestion
      - Eating involves trust.
      - e) Eating is personal
  - "The bread that I give is My flesh"—v. 51
