Do You Have a Pioneering Heart? Romans 15:14-24

TWO REASONS WHY PAUL FELT A SENSE OF RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE ROMAN CHURCH

- 1. Paul felt a responsibility for the Roman church because God called Him to be the apostle to the Gentiles.
- 2. Paul felt a responsibility for the Roman church because of his Godgiven geographical direction.

THREE KEY QUESTIONS

1. If they were already spiritually strong, why did Paul write to the Romans?

Because he had a responsibility before God to make sure that the foundation had been laid there.

2. Why hadn't Paul visited the Roman church yet, even though he wanted to?

Because he was moving geographically from east to west, and he kept finding places in which the foundation had not yet been laid.

3. If Paul was eager to come to Rome, why was he only going to stop briefly on his way to Spain?

Because he was a foundation-layer, and if the foundation had already been laid there, his calling was to continue moving west, beyond Rome.

HOW DID PAUL DECIDE WHEN THE FOUNDATION HAD BEEN LAID IN A PARTICULAR AREA?

1.	The gospel had been offered to the Jews (Romans 15:8; 1:16)
2.	People had come to obey the gospel (Romans 15:18)

3.	People who did not know and worship Jesus had come to know and worship Him (Romans 15:20-21)
4.	The believers were well-grounded in the truths of Romans 1:1-15:13 (Romans 15:15)
5.	The believers were full of goodness and knowledge and able to instruct one another in their local church (Romans 15:14)

6.	Healthy churches had been planted in strategic cities (Romans 15:19)

"As Acts reveals, Paul's strategy was to concentrate his missionary activity on the great urban centers of his day."

"Paul did not need to reach every individual; he believed that once an indigenous church was founded, it could reach its own culture."²

7. The believers in the churches that had been planted had the pioneering heart themselves (Romans 15:24; Romans 16)
