## The Principles of Comfort (Part II)

Blessed are they that mourn: for they shall be comforted. (Matthew 5:4)

Comfort: To strengthen (morally or spiritually); to encourage, hearten, inspirit, incite.

To minister delight or pleasure to; to gladden, cheer, please, entertain.

To soothe in grief or trouble; to relieve of mental distress; to console, solace. (The ordinary current sense.)

Relief or support in mental distress or affliction; consolation, solace, soothing.

## The Principles of Comfort Blessed be God, even the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies, and the God of all comfort; (2 Corinthians 1:3) Let not mercy and truth forsake thee: bind them about thy neck; write them upon the table of thine heart: So shalt thou find favour and good understanding in the sight of God and man. (Proverbs 3:3-4) Now when Job's three friends heard of all this evil that was come upon him, they came every one from his own place; Eliphaz the Temanite, and Bildad the Shuhite, and Zophar the Naamathite: for they had made an appointment together to come to mourn with him and to comfort him. (Job 2:11) How then comfort ye me in vain, seeing in your answers there remaineth falsehood? (Job 21:34) I also could speak as ye do: if your soul were in my soul's stead, I could heap up words against you, and shake mine head at you. But I would strengthen you with my mouth, and the moving of my lips should asswage your grief. (Job 16:4-5)
