A Pharisee and a tax collector

I. Confessions of A Self-Righteous Man: Pride & Conceit (18:11-12)

- A. self-righteous man sees himself as super-spiritual
- '11 The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself'
- B. The Self-righteous man is proud/boastful, he can approach God.

"The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, 'God'"

- C. The self-righteous man's gratitude is actually ingratitude "I thank God"
- D. The self-righteous man is loveless and judgmental vs 11b "extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this tax collector"
- E. The Self-righteous man trusts in his religion for acceptance with God vs 12 "I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I possess."

II. The Confession of a Humble Sinner (18: 13,14)

A. A sinner – conscious of who he really is

Vs 13 'And the tax collector'

- B. A sinner Consciousness of alienation from God guilt of his sin vs 13 standing afar off, would not so much as raise his eyes to heaven
- C. A sinner's real grief and sorrow for sin

vs 13 'beat his breast'

D. A sinner's plea for atoning mercy

vs 13 'saying be merciful to me a sinner'

III. Jesus' Declaration: "Justified" (18:14)

- V 14 "I tell you" Jesus' authority
- V 14 this man went down to his house justified rather than the other
- "everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted"
