"Heaven Shaken and Heaven Opened"

Matthew 24:29-31

Big Idea: Jesus now describes the sign of his coming at the end of the age.

Hint: this sign will not be something hidden or cryptic. It will involve the unraveling of the created universe and the sight of the returning Christ.

- I. The powers of the heavens will be shaken. (verse 29)
 - A. This will happen immediately after climactic tribulation. (verse 29a)
 - B. This will involve the shaking of all creation. (verse 29b)

Genesis 1:1, 14–19; 8:20–22; 2 Peter 3:1–7; Zechariah 14:6–7; Isaiah 13:6–13; 34:1–4; Joel 2:28–32; Luke 21:25–28; Haggai 2:6–7, quoted in Hebrews 12:25–27; Joel 3:1–3, 9–16; Revelation 6:12–17; 16:17–21; 20:7–11

- II. The heavens will display the coming Son of Man. (verses 30–31)
 - A. The royal approach of the Son of Man will be visible to the entire earth.
 - B. The approach of the Son of Man will smite the world with grief and terror.Revelation 1:7
 - C. The Son of Man will come with visible and indescribable power and glory.

 Daniel 7:13–14; Nahum 1:2–8; Matthew 16:27
 - D. The Son of Man will be attended by the entire heavenly host.

Matthew 25:31–32; Revelation 19:6–8, 11–16; 2 Thessalonians 1:5–10 (Compare with 2 Kings 6:15–17.)

- E. The Son of Man will then gather his elect to share his glory.
 - 1. A loud trumpet will signal this gathering.

Old Testament Precedents of Such a Trumpet Blast: Exodus 19:9, 16–20; 20:17–19; Leviticus 25:8–10; Numbers 10:1–10; Joshua 6:2–5

2. The angels will gather the elect.

Compare with Hebrews 1:13–14; Luke 16:22a; 2 Kings 2:11.

The Elect at Christ's Return: Matthew 25:33-34, 41, 46

- 3. All the elect, both living and dead, will be gathered.
 - 1 Thessalonians 4:13–18; 5:9–10
