But Paul is not naïve. He knows that believers are engaged in a battle and therefore he exhorts them to stand firm in the Lord. The fact that they must stand firm clearly suggests that there are elements at play that will threaten their footing. So, standing firm, they must be prepared to withstand and conquer trials and temptations they will inevitably face. But we must consciously and doggedly stand firm on the foundation we have in Christ – resisting temptations and trials that come arise within and from outside the body of Christ.
