- The gripe of the elder brother in the parable of the Prodigal

#### Grace Formula

## A. Man's Formula—Matthew 19:16-28

- a. The rich, young man looking for eternal life
  - 1. Jesus exposes his sin through the use of the Law
  - 2. The "work" is to believe in Christ—John 6:27-29
  - 3. Problem was not his riches, but the object of trust
  - 4. Salvation impossible for man, but possible with God
- b. Peter's question about rewards—vv. 24-28

### B. Grace's Formula—Matthew 20:1-16

- a. Stated: "Many who are first will be last, and the last first."
- b. Illustrated: The Parable of the Landowner
  - 1. Story explained
    - a) The local labor pool
    - b) Pay day, every day—Lev. 19:13; Deut. 24:15
    - c) Jewish work-day
    - d) The equal pay for unequal work?
    - e) The generous, gracious nature of the landowner.
  - 2. Spiritual significance
    - a) "Who" represents "what" in the story
    - All who come to faith in Christ receive the same gracious salvation, with no exceptions or variances.
    - c) Embodiment of GRACE: God's free and unmerited favor shown to guilty sinners
  - 3. Application. Because of Grace....
    - a) God sovereignly initiates and accomplished salvation.
    - b) God alone establishes the terms of salvation—Eph. 2:1-5, 8-9
      - 1) By Grace, not by works—Titus 3:5
      - 2) Through faith—Gal. 2:16; Rom. 3:28
      - 3) Works follow salvation—Eph. 2:10
    - c) God continues to call men into His kingdom.
