Prelude Call to Worship

We repeat this psalm as our call to worship, today noting that it mentions that God lifts the needy and makes them sit with princes, the very theme of our service today: that the path to blessing leads through suffering, and the path to glory is through humility, even sometimes humiliation.

Psalm 113 ESV

- Praise the LORD!
 - Praise, O servants of the LORD, praise the name of the LORD!
- 2 Blessed be the name of the LORD from this time forth and forevermore!
- 3 From the rising of the sun to its setting, the name of the LORD is to be praised!
- 4The LORD is high above all nations, and his glory above the heavens!
- 5 Who is like the LORD our God, who is seated on high,
- 6 who looks far down on the heavens and the earth?
- 7 He raises the poor from the dust and lifts the needy from the ash heap,
- 8 to make them sit with princes, with the princes of his people.
- 9 He gives the barren woman a home, making her the joyous mother of children. Praise the LORD!

* Reading from the Law

God's way with His people has never changed; He allows them to experience hardships and trials so as to discipline them and to teach them that the trust that leads to obedience, even in the midst of challenging circumstances, always leads to ultimate blessing. God commands us here to know and understand this dynamic, and to live accordingly.

Deuteronomy 8:1-6ESV

"The whole commandment that I command you today you shall be careful to do, that you may live and multiply, and go in and possess the land that the LORD swore to give to your fathers. ² And you shall remember the whole way that the LORD your God has led you these forty years in the wilderness, that he might humble you, testing you to know what was in your heart, whether you would keep his commandments or not. ³ And he humbled you and let you hunger and fed you with manna, which you did not know, nor did your fathers know, that he might make you know that man does not live by bread alone, but man lives by every word that comes from the mouth of the LORD. ⁴ Your clothing did not wear out on you and your foot did not swell these forty years. ⁵ Know then in your heart that, as a man disciplines his son, the

LORD your God disciplines you. ⁶ So you shall keep the commandments of the LORD your God by walking in his ways and by fearing him.

Silent Confession of Sin Corporate Confession of Sin

This appeal to God for mercy in spite of sin references deliverance from trials caused by enemies, and asks for grace to understand and follow the path of obedience, so silencing the accusations of enemies, the very thing exhorted in our passage for the past two weeks in I Peter.

Assurance of Pardoning Grace

We repeat again today last week's assurance of pardon, it being so appropriate to the main theme of our sermon today.

Philippians 2:3-11 ESV

³ Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. ⁴ Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. ⁵ Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, ⁶ who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, ⁷ but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. ⁸ And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. ⁹ Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the

earth, 11 and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Distribution of Elements

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer wine and encourage those who take part in Communion to take this. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer the option of grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles of the trays.
