The church at Corinth accused Paul:

- "You never visit us."
- "You have to work a second job."
- "You're not a great communicator."
- "You're too bossy."
- "You're weak—all bark and no bite."
- "You're in it for the money."

The Perfect Recipe

Relational tensions with those you love

- + physical hardships / chronic pain
- + consistent rejection by many
- + hatred from your enemies
- + financial pressures
- + constant church responsibilities

DISCOURAGEMENT

Some parts of the good news turn off hearers:

- The Bible is true and authoritative.
- God is your creator and judge.
- You're a rebel against God by nature who can't do anything to save yourself.
- Jesus is God-become-man, Earth's appointed king, and the only way to God.
- Those who trust Jesus must show it.
- Those who reject Jesus face eternal hell.

Distort the message? No.

- Verses 3-4, If people don't like the message, it's because they're spiritually blind. That's why they can't perceive that Jesus is so beautiful and necessary.
- Verse 5, Don't get it backwards. Your life is about Jesus, not you. He's Lord, and you're his servant.
- Verse 6, When we speak the undiluted message and exalt Jesus, God will miraculously open the eyes of some.

Paul's main point in 2 Corinthians 4

To keep persevering in the face of discouragement, you must remember that serving Jesus is a privilege, that it's all about Jesus not you, that it's supposed to look like the cross, and that it will be worth it all.
