Professing our Faith

Westminster Shorter Catechism

Q. 186. What rule hath God given for our direction in the duty of prayer?

A. The whole Word of God is of use to direct us in the duty of prayer; but the special rule of direction is that form of prayer which our Savior, Christ, taught His disciples, commonly called The Lord's Prayer.

Q. 187. How is The Lord's Prayer to be used?

A. The Lord's Prayer is not only for direction, as a pattern according to which we are to make other prayers; but may be also used itself as a prayer, so that it is done with understanding, faith, reverence, and other graces necessary to the right performance of the duty of prayer.

Q. 188. Of how many parts doth The Lord's
Prayer consist?

**A. The Lord's Prayer consists of three parts:
a preface, petitions, and a conclusion.**

Q. 189 What does the preface of
The Lord's Prayer teach us?

A. The preface of The Lord's Prayer (contained in these words, "Our Father Who art in heaven,") teaches us, when we pray, to draw near to God with confidence of His fatherly goodness, and our interest in it; with reverence, and all other childlike attitudes, heavenly affections,

and due

**understanding of His sovereign
power, majesty, and gracious
condescension: as also, to pray with and
for others.**
