Introduction: Jesus used three parables to demonstrate the failure of the religious leaders in Jerusalem to respond to God's call and the consequences of their failure for Israel. Now the religious leaders ask 3 questions in an attempt to entangle Jesus in controversy and turn the crowd against Him. He avoids the traps they try to set and then asks a question in return that they cannot answer. Their inability to discredit Him and answer His question sets up His denouncement of them in the following chapters.

- I. Invitation to Treason vs. 15-22 (Pharisees)
 - A. A Poll Tax
 - 1. Imposed on non-Roman citizens living in Roman Provinces
 - 2. Paid annually by men, women, and children
 - 3. Paid with a Denarius
 - a. Caesar's image
 - b. The inscription "Divi Filius" son of god
 - c. Rome allowed Jews to use their own coinage as the Denarius was considered idolatrous
 - B. Revolt against Rome
 - 1. Judas in AD 6
 - 2. The rise of the Zealots
 - 3. War for Independence AD 66-70
 - C. Answers
 - 1. A negative answer pits Jesus against Roman authority
 - 2. A positive answer angers the Jewish crowd
 - 3. Whose coin is it?
 - 4. Jesus' answer give back to Caesar what is his, and give to God what is His

1 Corinthians 15:39-49

39 All flesh is not the same flesh, but there is one kind of flesh of men, another flesh of animals, another of fish, and another of birds. 40 There are also celestial bodies and terrestrial bodies; but the glory of the celestial is one, and the glory of the terrestrial is another. 41 There is one glory of the sun, another glory of the moon, and another glory of the stars; for one star differs from another star in glory. 42 So also is the resurrection of the dead. The body is sown in corruption, it is raised in incorruption. 43 It is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory. It is sown in weakness, it is raised in power. 44 It is sown a natural body, it is raised a spiritual body. There is a natural body, and there is a spiritual body. 45 And so it is written, "The first man Adam became a living being." The last Adam became a life-giving spirit. 46 However, the spiritual is not first, but the natural, and afterward the spiritual. 47 The first man was of the earth, made of dust; the second Man is the Lord from heaven. 48 As was the man of dust, so also are those who are made of dust; and as is the heavenly Man, so also are those who are heavenly. 49 And as we have borne the image of the man of dust, we shall also bear the image of the heavenly Man.
