## Acts 2:42-47

## THE CHURCH TO WHICH THE LORD ADDED

- I. What is this adding?
  - A. First, the adding is being done to a local congregation.
  - B. Second, the adding is being done by "the Lord."
    - 1. This is the crucified, risen, and exalted Jesus Who sits at God's right hand.
    - 2. It is most proper and necessary that the Lord does the adding to His church.
  - C. How does the Lord Jesus cause the church to grow? Look at context of the chapter when 3000 were added.
    - 1. Two things involved: Spirit of Christ was just poured out and the church was active in Peter's preaching.
    - 2. This clearly implies a very close relationship of the saving of men and church membership.
- II. Our text speaks of church growth at the end of a statement about the life of the church at Jerusalem (42-47a)
  - A. Normally, the local church which grows has a healthy spiritual condition.
  - B. The healthy spiritual condition of the local church consists of three things.
    - 1. First, there is a steadfast continuing in the apostles' doctrine (teachings).
    - 2. Second, the church at Jerusalem was characterized by the fellowship of the members with each other.
    - 3. Third, the church was highly spiritual, for the "fear" of God was in every soul.
  - C. That congregation grew numerically and spiritually.
    - 1. If there is no adherence to God's Word as only rule for faith and life, those outside will not pay attention to our confession.
    - 2. But if there is spiritual health as described in our text, then God will add to that local church!
