Why is this verse important to Biblical counseling?

Nouthetic Ministry Defined

Pastor Walt Willett Grace Baptist Church of Indianapolis Section 1 Definition

Definition: The verb (noutheteo) - means instruct, admonish, warn. The Theolgoical Dictionary of the New Testament edited by Kittle states "noutheto means to impart understanding. With the accusative of a person (direct object), it means to set right. With a double accusative (direct and indirect object), it means to set right or to have a corrective influence on someone. Socrates took aside someone who had unintentionally given a false account of something in order to instruct and warn him. Teach (didasko) means primarily to effect the intellect or to show how." In contrast, noutheto describes an effect on the heart that convicts the conscience, challenges the beliefs influencing the will. It assumes an opposition which has to be overcome. It seeks to put right what is wrong. The basic idea is well meaning earnestness with which one seeks to influence the mind and disposition by appropriate instruction, exhortation, warning, and correction." The dominant meanings of noutheteo are to admonish, warn, soothe, remind, correct." It takes place through verbal communication. It does not mean to punish, but through words, to appeal to the moral consciousness for the purpose of gaining a hold over a man and bringing him to conviction and repentance (Adapted from Kittle).

Noun Usage: Kittles states, "The noun (nouthesia) means admonition, warning, and correction. It corrects while not provoking or embittering."

The Need for Biblical Counsel

- 1. Man needs counsel. Even before the fall, man needed counsel from God concerning his responsibilities, and life's dangers. Gen. 2.
 - a. Without counsel from God, life is absurd and meaningless. Ecclesiastes
 - b. Truly man does not live by bread alone but by every Word that proceeds from the mouth of God. Matt. 4:4
- 2. Sin came into the world, when man turned from God's counsel to devilish counsel.
 - a. Only two kinds of counsel; God's or Satan's.
 - b. God's truth or Satan's lies.
- 3. Satan sought to overthrow God's counsel.
 - a. Satan cast doubt Gen. 3:1
 - b. Satan distorted God's Word. Gen. 3:2-3
 - c. Satan denied God's Word. Gen. 3:4
 - d. Satan denounced God himself. Gen. 3:5
 - e. Today, through the world and its so-called knowledge, which appeals to our flesh, Satan uses the same approach to distort God's counsel over and over again. I Tim. 6:20-21.
- 4. Adam and Eve participated.
 - a. Listened to wrong counsel.
 - b. Became confused.
 - c. Bought the wrong counsel and rebelled against God.
- 5. Consequences:
 - a. Eternal spiritual death.
 - b. Immediate
 - 1) Gained the knowledge of good and evil.
 - 2) Gain guilt, separation from God and man, blindness, ran (escape), hid, tried to cover and blamed others.
 - c. Nature Sin affected creation Rom. 8:22, 2 Cor. 4:1-7
 - d. Future We were all born sinners.
 - e. Today- All of our counseling problems are rooted in the fall and sin.
 - 1) We live in a fallen world.
 - 2) We are impacted by the sins of others.
 - 3) We are impacted by our own sin.
- 6. The spiritual war goes on.
 - a. God through the Holy Spirit, using the Word as ministered by the church, provides true counsel, and in that counsel tells us how to undo the wrong counsel.
 - b. Satan through the world's system, which includes secular institutions of learning, media and political bodies; entertainment industry distributes false, erroneous, and half true counsel.
 - c. The scientific method is limited by the noetic effect of sin, and according to Rom. 1 began when we refused to honor God as God and give thanks.
 - d. Truth corresponds to reality, is internally consistent, and works when applied to life situations. Satan's lies do not work when applied, because they are not truth.
 - e. Sinful-unregenerate man may stumble across some dimension of truth which hedistort because of sinful biases.
 - f. The same truth will be found in purer form in God's Word, which makes secular counseling knowledge nonessential for the Biblical counselor.
 - 1) Behavior modification rediscovered some Biblical principles (Deut. 27. 28; Prov. 20:30; Eph. 2:2-3).
 - 2) Depth psychology saw man's inner conflicts but wrongly described man's inner conflict (Gal. 5:16-23).
 - 3) Humanistic psychology created a poor substitute for Biblical love (I Cor. 13:4-8).
 - 4) Rational emotional therapy rediscovered the importance of thinking, but it did not tie it to God's truth.

- g. Legitimate psychology may discover some things, but because they are kernels of truth they will be consistent with, illustrate, or amplify God's Word.
- 7. The battle for truth and error.
 - a. Truly all truth is God's truth.
 - b. All error is the devil's lie.
 - c. Modern so-called knowledge is not always true. Some of it contains the devil's lies.
 - d. Just as you cannot serve God and mammon; you cannot cling to God's truth while dabbling in the world's so -called knowledge.
 - e. Concerning issues God speaks of in His Word, we humbly accept, give thanks for His counsel, believe, and obey His counsel.
 - f. Concerning issues God does not speak of directly, we use the counsel He gives to judge all opinions.
- 8. Listening to God's counsel is the way to life and its blessings. Psalms 1

The blessed man:

- a. Does not seek out ungodly counsel, nor stand with those who have denied itnor sit with those who scorn God's counsel.
- b. Instead, they delight in God's Word, and meditate on God's Word day and night.
- c. God's counsel as revealed in the Word, gives life, makes us fruitful, and causes us to prosper in pleasing God and bringing glory to His name.

- VI. Don't many pastors fall into moral sin through counseling?
 - 1. They fall through working with the organist and the church secretary also.
