6. Jesus of Nazareth (Part 1) - Matthew 2:1-12

- I. King Herod vs. 1
 - A. An Idumean Edomite
 - 1. Descended from Esau Gen. 25:30; Rom. 9:10-13
 - 2. Converted to Judaism by force
 - 3. Appointed Tetrarch by Mark Antony
 - 4. Questioned as to his Jewishness, committed to refurbish the Temple
 - B. The History of Edom and Israel
 - 1. Edom refused to allow Israel to pass through their land on the way to the Promised Land Numbers 20:14-21; 21:4-9; 24:15-19
 - 2. Defeated and subjected by David at the Valley of Salt 2 Sam. 8:13-14; 1 Kings 11:14-22; 1 Chron. 18:12-13; Psa. 60:2
 - 3. Rebelled against Solomon and won independence as the kingdom split
 - 4. King Jehoshaphat conquered them again 50 years later 2 Chron. 17:11; 1 Kings 22:47-49
 - 5. Rebelled under Joram 2 Kings 8:20-22
 - 6. King Uzziah subjected them again 2 Kings 14:7, 22; 2 Chron. 25:11-12
 - 7. Rebelled again 2 Chron. 28:17
 - 8. Conquered by Assyria
 - C. A Cursed People
 - 1. Condemned by Isaiah, Jeremiah, Obadiah, and Malachi (plus others) Isa. 63:1-4; Mal. 1:1-5; Obadiah 1
 - 2. During the intertestamental period, fought against the Maccabees
 - 3. John Hyrcanus conquered them in the 2nd century BC and forced their conversion to Judaism
 - 4. Fought with the Jews against Rome in 70 AD
- II. The King of the Jews vs. 2-3
 - A. Wise Men from the East
 - 1. Magi magicians, skilled astrologers and astronomers from Persia Dan. 1:20; 2:2, 10, 27-30, 46-49
 - 2. Not many wise 1 Cor. 1:26 yet some seek Him Ryle Quote #1
 - B. The Star
 - 1. A comet
 - 2. The conjunction of Saturn and Jupiter in the constellation Pisces in 6 BC (Johannes Kepler) next occurrence Dec. 21, 2020
 - 3. Shekinah Glory it moved, stopped, and persisted for at least 2 years see vs. 9
 - C. The Stir both Herod and Jerusalem stirred up by their arrival
- III. The King Born in Bethlehem vs. 4-8
 - A. Where? The House of Bread Ryle Quote #2 (they knew, but didn't go)
 - B. Bethlehem of Judea, just north of Edom Micah 5:2
 - C. The Conspiracy to Commit Murder (vs. 7-8)

- IV. The King Worshipped by Wise Men vs. 9-12
 - A. The Young Child, now Housed
 - B. Exceeding Joy, Worship, and Gifts from Gentiles first!
 - 1. Gold King
 - a. Pesian custom: when you appear before a King you offer a gift of gold
 - b. Signifying royalty
 - c. Perhaps funded trip to Egypt?
 - 2. Frankincense Worship/Priesthood Phil. 4:18
 - a. Mixed with oil to anoint the priests
 - b. Firstfruit and free-will offerings Lev. 2:1-3, 11-16
 - 1) Never mixed with sin offerings
 - 2) Incense, salt, with no leaven sinless
 - c. Our Great High Priest Heb. 4:14-16; 5:6
 - 3. Myrrh Death/Prophet
 - a. Embalming John 19:39
 - b. Pain killer Mark 15:23
 - c. Remembering the prophets Acts 7:52-53; 1 Thess. 2:14-16; Deut. 18:15; Matt. 7:5
 - 4. Proclaiming Jesus to be Prophet, Priest, and King
 - C. Divinely Warned they Departed
