

Why did Jesus the Christ enter the world?

- *to Seek and save that which was lost (Luke 19.10)
- *to lay down his life for his sheep (John 10.11)
- *to give his life as a ransom for many (Mark 10.45)
- *he will save his people from their sins (Mark 1.21)

• **CONTEXT of Mark 8-9**

- the RECOGNITION of the Christ (8:27-30)
- the REJECTION of the Christ (8:31-33)
- the REQUIREMENTS of the Christ (8:34-38)
- the RADIANCE of the Christ (9:1-13)

Mark chapters 8-10 now lead us to the Passion Week with two repeated themes: the sufferings of the Messiah & submission to the Messiah (the divine mission & the discipleship mission); cf. Mark 8:31; 9:31; 10:33-34.

I. BEHOLD YOUR SUFFERING SAVIOR! (31)

✓ WHAT ARE THE DIVINE NECESSITIES of Christ’s Passion.

1. He must **SUFFER**
2. He must be **REJECTED**
3. He must be **KILLED**
4. He must **RISE AGAIN**

◆ **SCRIPTURES on SUFFERINGS OF MESSIAH:**

- ✓ Psalm 22
- ✓ Zechariah 12:10
- ✓ Dan 9:24-27
- ✓ **Jesus affirmed this: Luke 24:25 & Luke 24:45!**

II. BEWARE OF WORLDLY THINKING! (32-33)

Peter's rebuke (32)

Jesus' rebuke (33)

✓ how do you know when your mind is NOT on God's interests but *man's*?

◆ **here are 4 warning flags —**

1. when we get angry at God's plans - and what he is doing in our lives.
2. when we begin to talk back at God and excoriate him for his works [maybe not external outrage, but internal anger]
3. when we begin to think that we have a better plan than God.
4. when we view life physically/emotionally rather than biblically/discerningly.

✓ How do you actively put your mind on God's interests, not man's?

◆ **here are 4 active pursuits —**

- ◆ Study God's Word
- ◆ Submit to Christ
- ◆ Refuse to Complain
- ◆ Trust His Plan
