Elim, The Place of Rest – Exodus 15:27

“The parallel between the nation of Israel in the Old Testament and the individual believer today is inescapable. We should invest in our freedom from slavery to sin, not in indulging the whims of the flesh, but in seeking to serve the God who redeemed us.” Pastor David Jeremiah

The LORD is the self-existing One Who reveals Himself!
He revealed Himself to Israel as:
The LORD who saved His people! – Ex. 14:30-31
The LORD who provides the needs of His people – Exodus 15:25

“I have heard the complaints of the children of Israel. Speak to them, saying, ‘At twilight you shall eat meat, and in the morning, you shall be filled with bread. And you shall know that I am the LORD your God.’”

Exodus 16:12

You shall know that I AM the LORD your God!
I am the Jehovah (the covenant-keeping, self-sufficient God who reveals Himself to man). Your Elohim (the name for the deity of God, written in the plural noun in form, but singular in meaning when it refers to the one true God.) This term for God suggests the Trinity.

Yahweh comes from the Hebrew verb which means “to be.” The name seems to have meant, “I Am.” That seems very simple. But think out the deep implications of that simple name.

The definition of the name is so simple, but the implication of the meaning is so rich and deep:

I AM

- A. He is the God who always has been and who always will be.
- B. He is the self-sufficient God.
- C. He is the unchangeable God.
