# Introduction

When Adam was created in the Garden of Eden, before the fall in sin. Adam was free not to sin. He had the ability to not sin. He could live a truly righteous life.
But He also had the ability to sin
His will was free to do Good or Evil.
He chose to sin....
Now after the Fall He is only able to sin.
He is unable to do true righteousness.
He is free from the ability to do good.
His Will is not bound in desire for evil

John Piper wrote,

"As soon as Adam fell into sin, human nature was profoundly altered. Now man was not able *not* to sin. In the fall, human nature lost its freedom not to sin."

When we are saved... our nature is radically changed again. We are no longer able only to sin. We are not able to do good.....and bad.

### Romans 6:20–22 (NKJV)

<sup>20</sup> For when you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness.

<sup>22</sup> But now having been set free from sin, and having become slaves of God, you have your fruit to holiness, and the end, everlasting life.

Some have argued that as a lost person, I can to good and evil. I do have the ability not to sin.

### Matthew 6:24 (NKJV)

<sup>24</sup> "No one can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or else he will be loyal to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon.

As a lost person we are slaves to sin cannot be a slave of righteousness too.

### John 3:1–8 (NKJV)

**3** There was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. <sup>2</sup> This man came to Jesus by night and said to Him, "Rabbi, we know that You are a teacher come from God; for no one can do these signs that You do unless God is with him."

<sup>3</sup> Jesus answered and said to him, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God."

### Pelagianism

is a heterodox Christian theological position which holds that the original sin did not taint human nature and that humans have the free will to achieve human perfection without divine grace.

### Semi-Pelagianism

Argues that with God's help, through a prevenient grace, God enables all to men to be brought to point, they the are alive enough to believe and repent on there own. In other words, God jump starts the process and then leaves it up to you to self determine if you come and believe in Christ.

The main proof text for this doctrine is

John 12:32 (NKJV) <sup>32</sup> And I, if I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all *peoples* to Myself." Is this verse saying,

that Christ will draw all men to a point that they then are able to decide on there on to believe or not.

### No and the reason are:

1. The "all" in the context is referring to the Greeks that are present, not every single human who ever lived.

### John 12:20-23 (NKJV)

<sup>20</sup> Now there were certain Greeks among those who came up to worship at the feast.

<sup>21</sup> Then they came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida of Galilee, and asked him, saying, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus."

<sup>22</sup> Philip came and told Andrew, and in turn Andrew and Philip told Jesus.

So now Jesus is aware of the Greeks seeking him. And he says, that he will draw, not only Jews but Greeks 2. The word "draw" in this context refers to the complete work of salvation and not a prevenient work to get it started and then let man finish it.

The other time is used this way is in

### John 6:44 (NKJV)

<sup>44</sup> No one can come to Me unless the Father who sent Me draws<u>him</u>; and I will<u>raise him</u> up at the last day.

The drawing brings one to salvation completely and they will be resurrected the last day.

Other non salvific uses of this word show that it is not a partial drawing. it is complete.

### John 18:10 (NKJV)

<sup>10</sup> Then Simon Peter, having a sword, drew it and struck the high priest's servant, and cut off his right ear. The servant's name was Malchus.

### John 21:11 (NKJV)

<sup>11</sup> Simon Peter went up and dragged the net to land, full of large fish, one hundred and fifty-three; and although there were so many, the net was not broken.

## Acts 16:19 (NKJV)

<sup>19</sup> But when her masters saw that their hope of profit was gone, they seized Paul and Silas and dragged *them* into the marketplace to the authorities.

### Acts 21:30 (NKJV)

<sup>30</sup> And all the city was disturbed; and the people ran together, seized Paul, and dragged him out of the temple; and immediately the doors were shut.

### James 2:6 (NKJV)

3. Since the word draw is clearly a completed work of salvation, then the "all" in John 12 cannot mean all men absolutely or we would have all men saved. And Universalism is not true.

## **III. The Effect**

The Effect can be summed up with one Word <u>Bondage</u>

John 8:31–34 (NKJV)

<sup>31</sup> Then Jesus said to those Jews who believed Him, "If you abide in My word, you are My disciples indeed. <sup>32</sup> And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free."

<sup>33</sup> They answered Him, "We are Abraham's descendants, and have never been in bondage to anyone. How *can* You say, 'You will be made free'?"

<sup>34</sup> Jesus answered them, "Most assuredly, I say to you, whoever commits sin is a slave of sin.

Of the 400 plus volumes of books that Martin Luther wrote. He said that the one book other than the catechism that was worth keeping was the one he wrote on the bondage of the will.

He knew that the entire understand of the marvelous and miraculous work of salvation and ones understanding of Grace depended fully upon your understanding of the bondage of the will.

If men have the ability of self determination to be the main cause, or reason they are ultimately saved, then the true nature of grace is removed and the glory of man is elevated and the praise of God is diminished.

### In other words,

Are you the ultimate and decisive factor that determined that you chose or believed in Christ. or

When you get to heaven will you say that God did all that he could do...Coming and dying and drawing me as far as he could, but in the end, I made the choice, I am the final and ultimate reason why I am here..

# 2. Bondage of Love for Evil and Sin and Darkness

John 3:19-20 (NKJV)

<sup>19</sup> And this is the condemnation, that the light has come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil. <sup>20</sup> For everyone practicing evil hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his deeds should be exposed.

You cannot enjoy as sweet what taste bitter to you.

We are not forced to do this against our will, this is our will.

This is the root of the will issue. Men have a free will but there will, will only work within the context of there loves and hates. What they love they will pursue. What they hate they will avoid.

This is also what makes men responsible before God to believe when they are unable to.

They are unable to come to Christ and believe in Christ because of there love for sin and there hatred of holiness and God.

They are not being held against their will so that they cannot come,

rather

they will not come because that is their will.

God is calling them out of sin and darkness, but they love their sin so much they are bound by it.

John 5:44 (NKJV)

<sup>44</sup> <u>How can you believe</u>, who receive honor from one another, and do not seek the honor that *comes* from the only God?
