Introduction

For the choir director; set to Al-tashheth. ("according to "Do Not Destroy" ESV; "to the tune of Do Not Destroy" NIV)

A Mikhtam (See Psalms 16, 56-60) of David.

Psalm 58 is a prayer to God for God to bring judgment on the wicked because of the abuse of power by unjust rulers. This psalm also anticipates the fulfilment of God's judgment on the wicked in which the righteous will rejoice.

Tyrants on Trial (1-2)

Questions:

¹Do you indeed speak righteousness, O gods? ("Do you indeed speak righteousness, you silent ones?" NKJV)

Psalm 82:1-8

Do you judge uprightly, O sons of men?

Indictments:

²No,

in heart you work unrighteousness;

On earth you weigh out the violence of your hands.

The Tyrants' Character (3-5)

They are radically corrupt from birth.

³The wicked are estranged from the womb;

These who speak lies go astray from birth.

Psalm 51:5

"Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, And in sin did my mother conceive me."

Romans 3:9-26

They are dangerous, deadly and determined.

⁴They have venom like the venom of a serpent;

Like a deaf cobra that stops up its ear,

⁵So that it does not hear the voice of charmers,

Application:

How can Christians Pray Imprecatory Psalms?

These are prayers not curses.

Matthew 6:9-10

⁹"Pray, then, in this way:

'Our Father who is in heaven,
Hallowed be Your name.

¹⁰'Your kingdom come.

Your will be done,
On earth as it is in heaven.

They are prayers for God to do what He has promised to do, in His covenant.

Acts 17:30-31

These prayers are against God's enemies, and assume that the Psalmist's enemies are the same as God's enemies:

Conversion is a possible way in which these prayers may be answered.

These prayers are against hardened sinners.
