Three Questions that Lead to Three Essential Lessons for Every Disciple of Jesus

1. The Disciples Question Jesus' Care

Lesson: Jesus never leaves His Disciples without His care

Jesus died on the cross for the sins of His people and gave us the Holy Spirit as a helper so that we would lead a more holy and God-centered life. God has always been faithful in His provision for His people

2. Jesus Questions the Disciples Faith

Lesson: A disciple's fears are indicators of a lack of faith

3. The Disciples Question Jesus' Identity

Lesson: Jesus is the All-Powerful God who has set His love on His disciples

The fact that Jesus was able to calm the storm by nothing more than a command caused them to recognize that He was indeed God. They were in great fear of Him and had great reverence for Him in that moment, as we should always and in every way.
