As we reviewed our glorious beginnings

- ➤ Did you notice how our living space was full of God's riches? (Ps. 104:24)
- Did you reflect on how perfect God made us? (Eccl. 7:29)
 Lo, this only have I found, that God hath made man upright!
- Did you realize we were invincible unless we willingly surrendered?

III. THE GLORY OF OUR RELATIONSHIP

- A. We humans have the gift of ability to form personal relationships with others
- B. God made us capable to have a personal relationship with Him (John
 - 1. the beauty of relationship is described as eternal life (John 17:3)
- C. This nature of this relationship between God and us
 - 1. This relationship is called a *covenant* (Hosea 6:7)
 - 2. This covenant is defined by specific requirements & promises
 - a. God as Creator LORD set all the terms of this covenant (Gen. 2:16)
 - c. God's command has permissive and prohibitive clause (Gen. 2:16-17)
 - d. God entered this relationship with Adam as our head (Rom. 5:12)
 - 3. The basis for the relationship: *total trust in God and obedience to God*
 - a. the tree of knowledge of good and evil was the test
 - b. quality joy growth of relationship was dependent on **obedience**
 - promise of *life* upon obedience is implied in Genesis 2 but confirmed in Leviticus 18:5; Romans 10:5; Galatians 3:12
 - tree of life functioned like a sacrament to the promise of life
 - 4. Obedience/disobedience would bring experiential knowledge of good/evil

Take along considerations ...

- A. For God to establish this covenant relationship with man was not natural
 - 1. It was God's condescending goodness to man
 - 2. The terms of the relationship were easy for a perfect Adam
 - 3. Adam's rebellious choice is the most shocking act
- B. What was God's answer upon our despicable act as human race?
 - 1. He did not turn His back on us as we did to Him: Gen. 3:15; Ps. 103:10 a. God *so loved* that He send His only begotten Son into death
 - b. God seeks in preaches bring glad tidings: Acts 3:26
 - 2. He promises life while we chose death (John 3:36) a. do not listen to Satan's discrediting the Gospel
 - b. repentance is the first step toward reconciliation: Luke 17:3-4

Come, ye sinners, poor and wretched, Weak and wounded, sick and sore; Jesus ready waits to save you, Full of pity, love and pow'r:

He is able, He is able,
He is willing, doubt no more.

Let not conscience make you linger,
Nor of fitness fondly dream;
All the fitness He requires
