Hymn of Response When I Survey the Wondrous Cross


When I survey the wondrous cross on which the Prince of Glory died; my richest gain I count but loss, and pour contempt on all my pride.

CMPC Sermon Notes for September 20, 2020

• Series: Genesis 12-25: Walking by Faith

• Message: The Cry of the Heart Psalm 130

Abraham was not walking by faith

- The heavens declare the glory of God
- Our restless hearts
- Our guilty hearts

The Cry's Desperation (vv. 1-2)

- What do these verses suggest about how we see ourselves?
- What are the "depths?" (cf. Ps. 69)
- How do we get out?
- The great heart cry of faith: this is a believer

The Cry's Reality (vv. 3-4)

- The problem: a holy God and sinful people
- No hope if God keeps his eyes on our sin
- But—God has a vision problem
- The forgiveness of God—the cross of Jesus
- What does God see when He looks at me?
- How does forgiveness lead to "fear?"
- A relationship is implied
- "Here the psalmist says, essentially, 'I fear You because of your forgiveess.' This means that 'the fear of God' contains joyful amazement as well as humble and sobering awe." —Tim Keller

The Cry's Wait (vv. 5-6)

- The watchmen watched the city at night and got off duty in the morning
- Waiting to hear from God
- Waiting for fellowship with God

The Cry's Promise (vv. 7-8)

- Newfound mercy and confidence causes the writer to want what he has for everybody else
- God's redemption is so great He can forgive all the sins of all His people

So What About Us?

- A world with unresolved guilt
- Corrie Ten Boom: "There is no pit so deep, that God's love is not deeper still."
- His grace is greater than all our sin
- There is forgiveness with the Lord!
