

“The King at the Time of the End”

Daniel 11:36–45

- I. This king will exalt his own person and might as the sole objects of worship. (verses 36–39)
  - A. He will exalt himself above all gods.
  - B. He will boast himself against the true God.
  - C. He will fulfill God’s purposes of indignation.
  - D. He will maintain a single-minded devotion to conquest.
  
- II. This king will have unprecedented success in political conquests. (verses 40–43)
  - A. This will signal “the time of the end”.
  - B. Unlike the Seleucids, he will decisively conquer his rival.
  - C. He will trample the glorious land of God’s people.
  - D. Some will escape his onslaught.
  
- III. This king will come to his end when he marches against God’s holy mountain. (verses 44–45)
  - A. News from a distance will alarm and enrage him.
  - B. He will threaten Zion, the holy mountain of assembly.
  - C. He will then meet swift and utter destruction.
